THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1483. (1) In a claim for damages alleging medical
- 2 malpractice by or against a person or party, the total amount of
- 3 damages for noneconomic loss recoverable by all plaintiffs, each
- 4 plaintiff, including an individual making a claim under section
- 5 2922, resulting from the medical malpractice of all defendants,
- 6 shall each defendant, must not exceed \$280,000.00 \$1,000,000.00 per
- 7 plaintiff and per defendant, unless, as the result of the

- 2 more of the following exceptions apply as determined by the court

- 5 per plaintiff and per defendant:
- 6 (a) The plaintiff is **functionally** hemiplegic, paraplegic, or

- 11 (ii) Injury to the spinal cord.
