

# SENATE BILL NO. 505

September 19, 2023, Introduced by Senators POLEHANKI, MCCANN, GEISS, SHINK and BAYER and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure," by amending section 11d of chapter XVII (MCL 777.11d), as amended by 2023 PA 83.
