- 3 Whereas, Fibromyalgia is a chronic disorder that affects
- 4 millions of individuals worldwide, causing widespread
- 5 musculoskeletal pain, fatigue, and sleep disturbances; and

Whereas, It is estimated that more than 10 million people in 1 2 the United States, including many in Michigan, are living with 3 fibromvalgia; and Whereas, Despite its prevalence, fibromyalgia remains a 4 5 misunderstood and underdiagnosed condition, which can lead to a 6 delay in treatment and a significant impact on the quality of life 7 for those living with the condition; and 8 Whereas, Education and awareness are essential to improving 9 the understanding and treatment of fibromyalgia; and 10 Whereas, Fibromyalgia Awareness Day, which is observed 11 annually on May 12th, provides an opportunity to educate the public, healthcare providers, and policymakers about the impact of 12 this condition, and to promote research that will lead to better 13 14 treatments and ultimately a cure; now, therefore, be it 15 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 16 this legislative body declare May 12, 2023, as Fibromyalqia Awareness Day in the state of Michigan. We encourage all residents 17 18 to learn more about this condition and to support those living with
