- 4 millions of individuals worldwide, causing widespread
- 5 musculoskeletal pain, fatique, and sleep disturbances; and
- 6 Whereas, It is estimated that more than 10 million people in

- 1 the United States, including many in Michigan, are living with
- 2 fibromyalgia; and
- 3 Whereas, Despite its prevalence, fibromyalgia remains a
- 4 misunderstood and underdiagnosed condition, which can lead to a
- 5 delay in treatment and a significant impact on the quality of life
- 6 for those living with the condition; and
- 7 Whereas, Education and awareness are essential to improving
- 8 the understanding and treatment of fibromyalgia; and
- 9 Whereas, Fibromyalgia Awareness Day, which is observed
- 10 annually on May 12th, provides an opportunity to educate the
- 11 public, healthcare providers, and policymakers about the impact of
- 12 this condition, and to promote research that will lead to better
- 13 treatments and ultimately a cure; now, therefore, be it
- 14 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 15 this legislative body declare May 12, 2023, as Fibromyalqia
- 16 Awareness Day in the state of Michigan. We encourage all residents
- 17 to learn more about this condition and to support those living with
