## Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2024-25 Year-to-Date:

1. Senate recommended the continuation of most sections of FY 2024-25 boilerplate. They include prohibiting employee discipline for communicating with legislature (Sec. 206), requiring restricted fund report (Sec. 212), retention of reports (Sec. 219), costs of policy changes (Sec. 220), priority on spending down of work projects (Sec. 222), report on intent to sell property (Sec. 224), submission of updated strategic plan (Sec. 229), spending down of ARP funds (Sec. 230), pharmaceutical research on suicide prevention (Sec. 416), and requiring board certified psychiatric care for veteran homes (Sec. 505). The bill included updated tuition benefit language to include the hybrid "National Guard member Benefit fund" (Sec. 307), allows for realignment of federal revenues for the MVFA without legislative action (Sec. 511), requires a report on "unenforceable boilerplate" (Sec.232), report on federal policy changes (Sec. 233). Guidelines for Selfridge (Sec.701), veteran homelessness grants (Sec. 702) and mitigating loss of Federal funds (Sec.703).

5. Michigan National Guard Member Benefits Program. Senate proposed to restructure the funding for the Michigan National Guard State Tuition Assistance Program (MINGSTAP) to broaden the purpose of the current general fund appropriation for the program to cover MINGSTAP and a new program (pending statutory changes) that would provide a subsidy for child care for National Guard members during their annual and weekend drilling, providing the guard with another program geared to supporting their recruiting and retention efforts. There would be no net funding change. The estimated cost of the child care program is \$2.3 million, covering the subsidy and associated staff costs to administer the program.
