## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4026

A bill to amend 1937 PA 94, entitled "Use tax act,"

by amending section 4ll (MCL 205.94ll), as added by 2023 PA 14.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 4ll. (1) Beginning 90 days after the effective date of the 2 amendatory act that added this section through December 31, 2024, 3 the The tax levied under this act does not apply to the storage, 4 use, or consumption of a firearm safety device. On the retail sale 5 or transfer of a firearm, the seller shall provide a written notice to the purchaser and shall post in a conspicuous manner at all 6 7 points of sale on the premises where firearms are sold a notice that says the following: "The state of Michigan has exempted the 9 sale of firearm safety devices from the sales and use tax imposed

- 1 by this state.". through December 31, 2024.".
- 2 (2) As used in this section:
- 3 (a) "Firearm safety device" means, except as otherwise
- 4 provided in subdivision (b), equipment, designed to prevent
- 5 unauthorized access to, or operation or discharge of, a firearm,
- 6 that is either of the following:
- 7 (i) A device that, when installed on a firearm, is designed to
- 8 prevent the firearm from being operated without first deactivating
- 9 the device.
- 10 (ii) A gun safe, gun case, lockbox, or other device that is
- 11 designed, in light of materials used, to prevent access to a
- 12 firearm by any means other than a key, a combination, biometric
- 13 data, or other similar means.
- 14 (b) Firearm safety device does not include a glass-faced
- 15 cabinet or other form of storage that is primarily designed to
- 16 allow for the display of firearms.
- 17 Enacting section 1. It is the intent of the legislature to
- 18 annually appropriate sufficient funds from the state general fund
- 19 to the state school aid fund created in section 11 of article IX of
- 20 the state constitution of 1963 to fully compensate for any loss of
- 21 revenue to the state school aid fund resulting from the enactment
- 22 of this amendatory act.
