A bill to amend 1974 PA 258, entitled "Mental health code,"

by amending section 273b (MCL 330.1273b), as added by 2020 PA 402.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 273b. (1) Subject to appropriation, the department shall
- 2 create and operate a competitive grant program to provide grants to
- 3 recovery community organizations. as provided in this section. Each
- 4 year, from available funds, the department shall award
- 5 \$5,000,000.00 in grants under this section to the following:

- 1 (a) Not fewer than 19 certified recovery community
- 2 organizations to offer or expand recovery support center services
- 3 or recovery community center services to **serve** individuals seeking
- 4 long-term recovery from substance use disorders.
- 5 (b) Nonprofit associations in this state that meet all of the 6 following requirements:
- 7 (i) Have recovery community organizations as members.
- 8 (ii) Have a primary purpose of educating about, advocating for, 9 and increasing awareness of recovery.
- 10 (iii) Connect recovery community organizations within this state
 11 to support the certification of recovery community organizations
 12 and to provide technical assistance to recovery community
 13 organizations awarded funding under this section.
- 14 (2) Each grant that the department awards under this section 15 shall not exceed \$150,000.00 must be as follows:
- 16 (a) If the applicant is a recovery community organization, a
 17 minimum of \$250,000.00 per applicant. However, the department shall
 18 not award a grant under this section to a recovery community
 19 organization in an amount that exceeds 50% of the organization's
 20 operating budget for the calendar year immediately preceding the
 21 date of the application.
- 22 (b) If the applicant is a nonprofit association described in 23 subsection (1)(b), \$250,000.00.
- 24 (3) In awarding a grant under this section, the department
 25 shall place priority on prioritize recovery community organizations
 26 that do meet all of the following requirements:
- (a) Provide recovery support navigation that includes thefollowing:
- (i) Multiple recovery pathways.

- 1 (ii) Assistance for individuals navigating recovery resources
- 2 such as detoxification, treatment, recovery housing, support
- 3 groups, peer support, and family support.
- 4 (iii) The promotion of community wellness and engagement.
- $\mathbf{5}$ (iv) Recovery advocacy that provides hope and encourages
- 6 recovery.
- 7 (v) A peer-led, peer-driven organization that offers recovery
- 8 to any individual seeking recovery from addiction.
- 9 (b) Provide recovery outreach education that includes the
- 10 following:
- 11 (i) On-site recovery education in the workplace.
- 12 (ii) All-staff employee meetings.
- 13 (iii) On-site support for employees and family members.
- 14 (iv) Connections for employees and family members of employees
- 15 suffering from addiction to local recovery resources such as
- 16 treatment, recovery housing, and support groups.
- 17 (v) Connections with employers to provide recovery advocacy.
- 18 (c) Provide recovery activities and events that include the
- 19 following:
- 20 (i) Safe, ongoing recovery activities and events.
- 21 (ii) Opportunities to volunteer and participate in activities
- 22 and events.
- 23 (iii) Opportunities for family members and supporters of
- 24 recovery to be involved.
- 25 (iv) Meetings and activities on nutrition, health, and
- 26 wellness.
- (v) Meetings and activities on mindfulness, meditation, and
- **28** yoga.

- 1 (d) Are a member of a nonprofit association described in 2 subsection (1)(b).
- 3 (4) Beginning March 31, 2027, a grant recipient under this
- 4 section shall file an annual report with the chairperson of each
- 5 standing committee that has jurisdiction over health policy issues
- 6 and to the chairpersons of the house and senate appropriations
- 7 committees. The report must include all of the following
- 8 information:
- 9 (a) An explanation of how grant funds are being spent.
- 10 (b) If the grant recipient is a recovery community
- 11 organization, all of the following:
- 12 (i) The staff-to-participant ratio.
- 13 (ii) A description of the types of recovery support services 14 offered to participants.
- 15 (iii) The number of participants receiving recovery support 16 services during the calendar year and an explanation of how the
- 17 participants and services were calculated and reported.
- 18 (iv) The average rate of improvement in participant recovery
- 19 capital measures for participants served during the previous
- 20 calendar year.
- 21 (c) The operating budget of the grant recipient for the
- 22 calendar year covered by the report, with details on each source of
- 23 the grant recipient's income.
- 24 (5) This section does not apply beginning October 1, 2031.
