A bill to amend 2016 PA 436, entitled
"Unmanned aircraft systems act,"
(MCL 259.301 to 259.331) by adding section 8a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 8a. (1) A police officer, or a private security officer
2 employed by a facility described in section 45a of chapter VII of
3 the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.45a, may intercept,
4 disable, or destroy an unmanned aircraft that is flying in a manner
5 that violates section 45a of chapter VII of the Michigan penal
6 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.45a.

1 (2) A police officer or private security officer who
2 intercepts, disables, or destroys an unmanned aircraft under
3 subsection (1) is not liable to the owner of the unmanned aircraft
4 for damage to the unmanned aircraft.

5 (3) This section applies only to the extent that this section
6 is not preempted by federal law.
