A bill to amend 2016 PA 436, entitled "Unmanned aircraft systems act," by amending section 22 (MCL 259.322).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 22. (1) A person shall not knowingly and intentionally
- 2 operate an unmanned aircraft system to subject an individual to
- 3 harassment. As used in this subsection, "harassment" means that
- 4 term as defined in section 411h or 411i of the Michigan penal code,
- 5 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.411h and 750.411i.
- 6 (2) A person shall not knowingly and intentionally operate an
- 7 unmanned aircraft system within a distance that, if the person were

- to do so personally rather than through remote operation of an
 unmanned aircraft, would be a violation of a restraining order or
 other judicial order.
- 4 (3) A person shall not knowingly and intentionally operate an unmanned aircraft system to violate section 539j of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.539j, or to otherwise capture photographs, video, or audio recordings of an individual in a manner that would invade the individual's reasonable expectation of privacy.
- 10 (4) An individual who is required to register as a sex
 11 offender under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL
 12 28.721 to 28.736, shall not operate an unmanned aircraft system to
 13 knowingly and intentionally follow, contact, or capture images of
 14 another individual, if the individual's sentence in a criminal case
 15 would prohibit the individual from following, contacting, or
 16 capturing the image of the other individual.
- 17 (5) A person shall not knowingly and intentionally operate an 18 unmanned aircraft system over a private dwelling in a manner that 19 prevents an owner or occupant of the property from the quiet 20 enjoyment of the dwelling.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
