## **SENATE BILL NO. 56**

February 04, 2025, Introduced by Senator ANTHONY and referred to Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

by amending sections 11 and 236 (MCL 388.1611 and 388.1836), section 11 as amended by 2024 PA 148 and section 236 as amended by 2024 PA 120, and by adding section 201i.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 11. (1) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025,
- 2 there is appropriated for the public schools of this state and
- ${f 3}$  certain other state purposes relating to education the sum of
- \$17,769,551,300.00 \$100.00 from the state school aid fund, the sum
- 5 of \$78,830,600.00 \$100.00 from the general fund, an amount not to

- 1 exceed \$41,000,000.00 \$100.00 from the community district education
- 2 trust fund created under section 12 of the Michigan trust fund act,
- 3 2000 PA 489, MCL 12.262, an amount not to exceed \$125,000,000.00
- 4 \$100.00 from the school transportation fund created under section
- 5 22k, an amount not to exceed \$71,000,000.00 \$100.00 from the
- 6 enrollment stabilization fund created under section 29, an amount
- 7 not to exceed \$30,000,000.00 \$100.00 from the school meals reserve

- 29 College Association, for the community college academic catch-up

- 1 program. Funds appropriated under this section must be used in
- 2 accordance with the requirements described for the community

The department of lifelong education, advancement, and 8 potential shall use funds appropriated under this subsection to 9 work with the Michigan Transfer Network, community colleges, public 10 universities, and other institutions of higher education in this 11 state to facilitate the transfer of students and acceptance of 12 credits among these institutions. The department may hire limited time FTEs or external consultants with the funds. The funds 13 14 allocated under this subsection for fiscal year 2024-2025 are a 15 work project appropriation, and any unexpended funds remaining at 16 the end of fiscal year 2024-2025 are carried forward into fiscal 17 year 2025-2026, and any unexpended funds remaining at the end of fiscal year 2025-2026 are carried forward into fiscal year 2026-18 19 2027. The purpose of the work project is to support transfer 20 pathways at postsecondary institutions in this state. The estimated 21 completion date of the work project is September 30, 2027. 22 (11) For fiscal year 2024 2025 only, from the appropriation described in subsection (1), \$980,000.00 is appropriated from the 23 24 state general fund/general purpose money for the FAFSA completion 25 incentive. The department of lifelong education, advancement, and potential shall use funds appropriated under this subsection to run 26 27 a promotional activity to promote completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the first time consistent with 28 29 the promotional-activity exception provided for in section 372(2)

of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.372. The 1 2 promotional activity must offer prize funds that are available to a number, chosen by the department, of randomly selected Michigan 3 4 residents who satisfactorily demonstrate to the department that they have completed the FAFSA for the first time. 5 6 (12) For fiscal year 2024-2025 only, from the appropriation 7 described in subsection (1), \$750,000.00 is appropriated from state 8 general fund/general purpose money to Western Michigan University 9 to support the Project Clean program. 10 (13) For fiscal year 2024-2025 only, from the appropriation 11 described in subsection (1), \$70,000.00 is appropriated from state 12 general fund/general purpose money to a city with a population between 70,000 and 80,000 in a county with a population between 13 14 225,000 and 275,000 according to the most recent federal decennial 15 census for investments to improve safety on the campus of a public 16 university based in that city. 17 (14) For fiscal year 2024 2025 only, subject to section 236r, 18 from the appropriation described in subsection (1), \$200,000.00 is 19 appropriated from state general fund/general purpose money for an 20 education performance study. 21 (15) All of the following apply for fiscal year 2024-2025 22 only: 23 (a) In addition to the allocations under subsections (4) and (9), there is allocated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for 24 25 payments to participating public universities, appropriated from 26 the state school aid fund. A public university that receives money

under this subsection shall use that money solely for the purpose

pension recipients of those participating public universities. 1 2 (b) The amount allocated in subdivision (a) must be allocated 3 to each participating public university based on each participating public university's percentage of the total combined payrolls of 4 5 the universities' employees who are members of the retirement system and who were hired before January 1, 1996 and the 6 7 universities' employees who would have been members of the 8 retirement system on or after January 1, 1996, but for the enactment of 1995 PA 272 for all public universities that are 9 10 participating public universities for the immediately preceding 11 state fiscal vear. 12 (c) Participating public universities receiving funds under this subsection shall forward an amount equal to the amount 13 14 allocated under subdivision (a) to the retirement system in a form, 15 manner, and time frame determined by the retirement system. 16 (d) Amounts allocated in subdivision (a) must be paid to participating public universities in 1 lump-sum installment no 17 later than October 31, 2024. 18 19 (e) As used in this subsection, "participating public 20 universities" means public universities that are reporting units of 21 the Michigan public school employees' retirement system under the public school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 22 38.1301 to 38.1437, and that pay contributions to the Michigan 23 24 public school employees' retirement system for the state fiscal 25 <del>year.</del>
