

SENATE BILL NO. 610

October 16, 2025, Introduced by Senators ANTHONY, SHINK, GEISS, CHANG, MCMORROW, BAYER, SANTANA and CAVANAGH and referred to Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled
"Public health code,"
(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding part 95A.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 PART 95A

2 UTERINE FIBROID DATABASE AND EDUCATION

3 Sec. 9551. (1) As used in this part:

4 (a) "Database" means the database established under section
5 9553.

6 (b) "Health professional" means an individual licensed,

1 registered, or otherwise authorized to engage in a health
2 profession under article 15.

3 (c) "Michigan board of medicine" means the board created under
4 section 17021.

5 (d) "Michigan board of osteopathic medicine and surgery" means
6 the board created under section 17521.

7 (2) In addition, article 1 contains general definitions and
8 principles of construction applicable to all articles in this code.

9 Sec. 9553. (1) The department shall establish and maintain an
10 electronic database of information related to uterine fibroids to
11 increase awareness about uterine fibroids and to ensure that women
12 receive the information and health care necessary to prevent and
13 treat the condition. The database must include all of the following
14 information:

15 (a) The incidence and prevalence of uterine fibroids in this
16 state.

17 (b) The demographic attributes of women diagnosed with uterine
18 fibroids in this state.

19 (c) Treatment and procedure options for uterine fibroids that
20 are used by health professionals.

21 (2) A health professional who diagnoses or treats a patient
22 with uterine fibroids shall submit data for inclusion into the
23 database in a form and manner required by the department by rule.

24 (3) The department shall not include any personal identifying
25 information of a patient in the database. Information contained in
26 the database is subject to the same requirements of confidentiality
27 as provided in section 2631 for data or records concerning medical
28 research projects.

29 (4) Within 2 years after the effective date of this section,

1 the department shall begin evaluating the data collected pursuant
2 to subsection (2) and publishing reports summarizing the data. The
3 first summary report must be published not later than 180 days
4 after the end of the first 2 full calendar years after the
5 effective date of this section. Subsequent annual summary reports
6 must be made on a full calendar year basis and published not later
7 than 180 days after the end of each calendar year.

8 Sec. 9554. (1) The department, in consultation with the
9 Michigan board of medicine and the Michigan board of osteopathic
10 medicine and surgery, shall promote public awareness and increase
11 knowledge about uterine fibroids in this state by developing and
12 disseminating educational materials that contain information on all
13 of the following:

14 (a) The race or ethnicity of women who have a statistically
15 elevated risk of developing uterine fibroids.

16 (b) The range of available treatment options for uterine
17 fibroids, including treatment and procedure options that do not
18 involve a hysterectomy.

19 (c) Any other information that the department considers
20 necessary or appropriate to educate the public and health
21 professionals.

22 (2) The department, on its website, shall make the information
23 described in subsection (1) available to the public and to health
24 professionals. The Michigan board of medicine and the Michigan
25 board of osteopathic medicine and surgery shall also disseminate to
26 health professionals the information described in this section.

27 Sec. 9554a. The department shall enter into an agreement with
28 nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, and
29 other persons considered appropriate by the director, to develop

1 and implement a public awareness campaign to disseminate
2 information on all of the following to the public:

3 (a) Uterine fibroids.

4 (b) The risks associated with uterine fibroids.

5 (c) Options other than a hysterectomy to treat uterine
6 fibroids, including, but not limited to, drugs and devices that are
7 approved under the federal food, drug, and cosmetic act, 21 USC 301
8 to 399i.

9 Sec. 9555. The department may promulgate rules to implement
10 this part. The rules may require a health professional to submit
11 information to the department under this part in the same time
12 frame and manner as a health professional submits other information
13 to the department under section 5111.
