SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5

Senators Brinks and Nesbitt offered the following concurrent resolution:

- 1 A concurrent resolution of tribute offered as a memorial for
- 2 Darwin Booher, former member of the Michigan Senate and Michigan
- 3 House of Representatives.
- 4 Whereas, It was with great sorrow that the members of the
- 5 Legislature learned about the passing of Darwin Booher. He will be
- 6 remembered as a dedicated public servant by his constituents in
- 7 northwest Michigan and the people of our great state; and
- 8 Whereas, Darwin Booher was born in 1942 at Rohen's Maternity
- 9 House in Evart, Michigan. He remained in Evart for much of his
- 10 life, graduating from Evart High School in 1961. Darwin furthered
- 11 his education by graduating from the University of Wisconsin School
- 12 of Banking and the Michigan Assessors School; and
- 13 Whereas, Darwin wore many different hats during his life.

- 1 Before starting his political career, he spent more than four
- 2 decades in the banking industry. He worked his way up the corporate
- 3 ladder, starting off as a vault teller and eventually becoming the
- 4 vice president of First National Bank, which later became Citizens
- 5 Bank; and
- 6 Whereas, Outside of Darwin's success in the corporate world,
- 7 he maintained a strong and steadfast passion for agriculture.
- 8 Darwin, whose family runs a seventh-generation family farm in
- 9 Evart, loved working the land and getting his hands dirty, and was
- 10 always willing to talk about anything related to agriculture. In
- 11 2018, Darwin was inducted into the Michigan 4-H Emerald Clover
- 12 Society, which honors former 4-H members for their leadership; and
- Whereas, During his life, Darwin was also a dedicated public
- 14 servant. He served as the Osceola Township supervisor and assessor
- 15 for 28 years. In 2004, he was elected to the House of
- 16 Representatives where he served three terms representing the One
- 17 Hundred-second District, before being elected to the Senate to
- 18 represent the Thirty-fifth District. He would serve in the Senate
- 19 until 2018. During his time in the Legislature, Darwin utilized his
- 20 knowledge, experience, and humor to serve on and lead a number of
- 21 committees. This included serving as the chair of the Senate
- 22 Committee on Banking and Financial Institutions, the Senate
- 23 Appropriations subcommittees on Capital Outlay and Community
- 24 Colleges, and the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Community
- 25 Colleges. He also served on many other committees including the
- 26 Senate committees on Appropriations, Agriculture, Education, and
- 27 Infrastructure Modernization, and the House committees on
- 28 Appropriations and Banking and Financial Services. He additionally
- 29 served on the Senate Appropriations subcommittees on General

- 1 Government, the Department of Community Health, the Department of
- 2 Environmental Quality, and Natural Resources, as well as the House
- 3 Appropriations subcommittees on the Department of Natural
- 4 Resources, Joint Capital Outlay, Community Colleges, Human
- 5 Services, Special Governmental Operations, Investigations, and
- 6 Intergovernmental Affairs and Oversight. Moreover, Darwin was
- 7 recognized by his colleagues when he was elected the Senate
- 8 assistant majority caucus whip; and
- 9 Whereas, Darwin's commitment to his community went beyond
- 10 elected office. He faithfully served in a number of roles including
- 11 the Board of Trustees for Spectrum Health, Reed City Campus;
- 12 charter member of the Evart Downtown Development Association; the
- 13 Evart Local Development Finance Commission; the Evart Jaycees; the
- 14 Evart Historical Society; and the Evart Chamber of Commerce; and
- 15 Whereas, Darwin was known to those around him as a true family
- 16 man, and he was always happiest when he could spend time with his
- 17 family. He and his wife of more than 60 years, Janice, made their
- 18 home in Evart, where they raised four children. His family expanded
- 19 to include six grandchildren, two step great-grandchildren, and one
- 20 great-grandson. During their marriage, Darwin and Janice also
- 21 opened their home to ten exchange students from all around the
- 22 world; and
- 23 Whereas, Darwin loved to remain active, even after leaving the
- 24 Legislature. He always looked forward to traveling, family
- 25 vacations, and testing his luck at the casino. Darwin loved to be
- 26 hands-on with his grandchildren, which included teaching them how
- 27 to drive on farming equipment. This led to more than a few dents,
- 28 but even more happy memories. Until his last moments, Darwin always
- 29 put his family first; and

1	Whereas, By those who knew him best, Darwin is remembered as
2	warm, welcoming, curious, and always willing to offer advice. He
3	always remained respectful of others and was committed to serving
4	and working for his constituents to the best of his ability; and
5	Whereas, Upon Darwin Booher's passing, we offer our
6	condolences to his loved ones. His contributions to these chambers
7	and the State of Michigan will be remembered; now, therefore, be it
8	Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
9	concurring), That we offer this expression of our highest tribute
10	to honor the memory of Darwin Booher, a member of Michigan's House
11	of Representatives from 2005 to 2010 and the Senate from 2011-2018;
