HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 134

Reps. Woolford, Kunse, Schuette, Robinson, Hoadley, DeBoyer, Tate, Meerman, Alexander, Fox and Witwer offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the
- 2 United States Marine Corps.
- 3 Whereas, The United States Marine Corps was founded on
- 4 November 10th, 1775, in Tun Tavern, Philadelphia to augment naval
- 5 forces in the Revolutionary War, prior even to the founding of the
- 6 United States; and
- 7 Whereas, The greatest weapon on earth is the Marine and his
- 8 rifle; and
- 9 Whereas, The Marine Corps motto Semper Fidelis, Latin for
- 10 "Always Faithful," reflects an eternal and collective commitment to
- 11 success in battle, the progress of our Nation, and the steadfast
- 12 loyalty each Marine has to the Marines they fight alongside; and

- 1 Whereas, The Marines have exemplified the highest standards of
- 2 honor, courage, and commitment, and continue to forge this legacy
- 3 of bravery and selfless dedication to our nation and its
- 4 Constitution today; and
- 5 Whereas, Marines have exhibited exemplary bravery and
- 6 sacrifice in defense of our freedoms in countless battles
- 7 throughout our nation's history; and
- 8 Whereas, The nickname "Devil Dog" was bestowed upon the
- 9 Marines by German soldiers at the Battle of Belleau Wood in June of
- 10 1918 due to the menacing appearance of Marines as they attacked a
- 11 hill occupied by German forces; and
- 12 Whereas, The Blood Stripes worn down the outside leg seams of
- 13 trousers on the dress uniforms of Marine Officers, Staff
- 14 Noncommissioned Officers, and Noncommissioned Officers commemorate
- 15 the courage and tenacious fighting of the men who fought in the
- 16 Battle of Chapultepec in September of 1847; and
- 17 Whereas, The nickname "Leatherneck" was also bestowed upon the
- 18 Marines in reference to the leather stock once worn around the neck
- 19 by Marines to protect from slashing blades and to keep the head and
- 20 neck erect when in uniform; and
- 21 Whereas, The Mameluke Swords carried by Marine Officers
- 22 represent a rich legacy of fighting by those who our Nation trusts
- 23 to win, after a Mameluke chieftain in North Africa presented the
- 24 sword to Lieutenant Presley O'Bannon in 1805; and
- 25 Whereas, The NCO Swords carried by Marine Noncommission
- 26 Officers and Staff Noncommissioned Officers were first bestowed to
- 27 Noncommissioned Officers by the 6th Commandant, Colonel John
- 28 Harris, in recognition of their leadership in combat; and
- 29 Whereas, The fighting spirit of each and every Marine

- 1 continues to flourish and ensure the defense of our nation against
- 2 enemies both foreign and domestic; and
- 3 Whereas, Michigan has a proud history of contributions to the
- 4 Marine Corps. In 1922, Detroit became home to a volunteer Marine
- 5 Corps Reserve company, laying the foundation for what would become
- 6 the 1st Battalion, 24th Marines; and
- 7 Whereas, The 1st Battalion, 24th Marines distinguished itself
- 8 in pivotal World War II battles, including Kwajalein, Tinian,
- 9 Saipan, and Iwo Jima. They continued their valorous service during
- 10 Operation Iraqi Freedom. During their deployment to Fallujah, Iraq,
- 11 the 1st Battalion, 24th Marines played a pivotal role in
- 12 counterinsurgency operations, contributing to the stabilization and
- 13 rebuilding efforts in the region; and
- 14 Whereas, The 1st Battalion, 24th Marines is headquartered at
- 15 Selfridge Air National Guard Base in Harrison Township and has
- 16 companies throughout the Midwest, including Battle Creek and
- 17 Lansing; and
- 18 Whereas, Corporal Duane E. Dewey, born in Grand Rapids,
- 19 Michigan, received the Medal of Honor for his actions during the
- 20 Korean War where he instinctively shielded his fellow Marines by
- 21 throwing himself onto an enemy grenade that came close to their
- 22 position. Despite being injured in a recent night attack, Cpl.
- 23 Dewey absorbed the full blast to protect those around him; and
- 24 Whereas, Private First Class Dewayne T. Williams, a Michigan
- 25 Marine, displayed extraordinary heroism and self-sacrifice during a
- 26 firefight with enemy forces, shielding his fellow Marines from a
- 27 grenade blast by throwing himself on it, saving their lives at the
- 28 cost of his own. Pfc. Williams was posthumously awarded the Medal
- 29 of Honor in recognition of his valor above and beyond the call of

- 1 duty; and
- 2 Whereas, Corporal Harold Schultz, a native of Detroit, was
- 3 later identified as one of the six Marines who proudly raised the
- 4 American flag atop Mount Suribachi during the Battle of Iwo Jima, a

- 5 powerful symbol of courage, sacrifice, and the unbreakable spirit
- 6 of our Marines in World War II; and
- 7 Whereas, The steadfast commitment, courage, and sacrifice of
- 8 United States Marines have made the Marine Corps an indispensable
- 9 force in defending freedom, safeguarding the nation, and upholding
- 10 the principles of ordered liberty; and
- 11 Whereas, As the United States Marine Corps commemorates its
- 12 250th anniversary, it is fitting to recognize and honor the
- 13 contributions of Michigan's Marines, past and present, who have
- 14 played a vital role in upholding the freedoms and values of our
- 15 nation; now, therefore, be it
- 16 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That members of this
- 17 legislative body commemorate the 250th anniversary of the United
- 18 States Marine Corps; and, be it further
- 19 Resolved, That we express our deepest gratitude to all Marines
- 20 for their unwavering service and sacrifice.
