

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 12

Senators Huizenga and Theis offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to designate February 20, 2025, as Conductive
2 Education Day.

3 Whereas, Over 70 years ago in Hungary, Conductive Education
4 (CE) was developed by Dr. András Peto; and

5 Whereas, CE is a unique teaching system that operates from a
6 core belief in neuroplasticity, the lifelong ability of the brain
7 to reorganize neural pathways based on new experiences, and on the
8 premise that no matter how severe the disability, people can learn
9 and improve when they are motivated; and

10 Whereas, Children and adults with neuromotor impairments, such
11 as stroke survivors and individuals with cerebral palsy, multiple
12 sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, spina bifida, or acquired brain
13 injuries can use CE to maximizes their mobility and independence;
14 and

1 Whereas, CE has the potential to make a significant, life-
2 changing impact on the motility and self-sufficiency of close to 9
3 million people in the United States and Canada; now, therefore, be
4 it

5 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
6 body designate February 20, 2025, as Conductive Education Day. We
7 encourage support for this important program.
