SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 29

Senators Chang, Singh, Cavanagh, Bayer, Wojno, Camilleri, Hertel, Shink, Irwin, Geiss, McMorrow, Moss and Santana offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to designate April 20-26, 2025, as Infertility
- 2 Awareness Week.
- 3 Whereas, Infertility is defined as the inability to conceive
- 4 after one year or longer of trying to have a child; and
- 5 Whereas, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 6 Prevention, one in eight couples suffer from infertility; and
- 7 Whereas, Infertility affects women and men equally, with male
- 8 infertility being a factor in roughly 50 percent of cases; and
- 9 Whereas, In the United States, nine percent of men and 11
- 10 percent of women have experienced fertility issues; and
- 11 Whereas, The most common types of fertility treatment are in
- 12 vitro fertilization (IVF) and intrauterine insemination (IUI); and

- 1 Whereas, Infertility can cause psychological distress,
- 2 emotional stress, and financial difficulties for couples who can
- 3 experience feelings of anger, guilt, sadness, depression, anxiety,
- 4 and a loss of self-confidence and self-esteem; and
- 5 Whereas, Raising awareness about infertility can remove
- 6 barriers to care; and
- 7 Whereas, Educating others on infertility can remove the stigma
- 8 and increase empathy and sympathy towards those facing infertility
- 9 problems; and
- 10 Whereas, It is critical that the state of Michigan explores
- 11 solutions to ensure greater access to infertility treatment so that
- 12 more citizens are able to start or grow their families; now,
- 13 therefore, be it
- 14 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 15 body designate April 20-26, 2025, as Infertility Awareness Week;
- 16 and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That we join The National Infertility Association
- 18 and dedicated volunteers, health care professionals, and members of
- 19 the infertility and family building community by participating in
- 20 this promotion.
