- 1 A resolution to commemorate the 35th anniversary of the
- 2 signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Whereas, On July 26, 1990, President George H.W. Bush signed
- 4 into law the Americans with Disabilities Act, a civil rights law
- 5 which prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities;
- 6 and
- Whereas, This year marks the 35th anniversary of the ADA, a
- 8 landmark federal law that protects the rights of people with
- 9 disabilities by eliminating barriers to their participation in many
- 10 aspects of living and working in our country and our state; and
- 11 Whereas, It is estimated by the United States Census Bureau
- 12 that nearly one in four, or 70 million, adults live with a

- 1 disability in America; and
- Whereas, The ADA helped to break down barriers that prevented
- 3 opportunities for people with disabilities to live and work in
- 4 their communities and participate fully in our economy and
- 5 democracy; and
- 6 Whereas, The ADA ensures fairness for all in many areas of
- 7 public life including jobs, schools, and transportation; and
- 8 Whereas, Every individual deserves respect, access, and equal
- 9 opportunity; and
- 10 Whereas, America and the state of Michigan are strong because
- 11 of the contributions of all of our citizens; and
- 12 Whereas, We recognize that our work to uphold the spirit and
- 13 the letter of the ADA is not yet finished; and
- 14 Whereas, We must continue to work together to build a society
- 15 in which differences are embraced, opportunities are made equally
- 16 available, and one that will leave no person behind; now,
- 17 therefore, be it
- 18 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 19 body commemorate the 35th anniversary of the signing of the
- 20 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); and be it further
- 21 Resolved, That we hold the highest regard for everyone who
- 22 contributed to the enactment of the ADA and those who continue to
- 23 uphold its principles. We urge all Michigan residents to
- 24 acknowledge and celebrate this occasion.
