HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 95

Reps. Morgan, Greene and Beson offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to express our commitment to strengthening and
- 2 deepening ties between the state of Michigan and Taiwan.
- 3 Whereas, Taiwan shares values of freedom, democracy, human
- 4 rights, rule of law, peace, and prosperity with the United States
- 5 and the state of Michigan; and
- 6 Whereas, Taiwan and the United States are key partners in
- 7 trade. The United States ranks as Taiwan's second-largest trading
- 8 partner, and in 2023, Taiwan was the United States' eighth-largest
- ${f 9}$ goods trading partner. Bilateral goods trade reached over 127.7
- 10 billion dollars in 2023 and over 158.6 billion dollars in 2024; and
- 11 Whereas, Taiwan is a particularly important market for United
- 12 States agricultural products. Taiwan imported 3.93 billion dollars'
- 13 worth of agricultural products from the United States in 2023, and

- 1 another 3.8 billion dollars' worth of agricultural and related
- 2 products in 2024. In 2022, the United States Department of
- 3 Agriculture noted that Taiwan was the fourth-largest export market
- 4 for U.S. agricultural products on a per capita basis. Furthermore,
- 5 in 2023, Taiwan was our nation's eighth-largest export market for
- 6 corn and our sixth-largest export market for soybeans. Due to our
- 7 nation's high-quality produce, the United States remains one of
- 8 Taiwan's largest sources of agricultural products, supplying nearly
- 9 a quarter of Taiwan's agricultural imports in 2023; and
- 10 Whereas, Taiwan and the state of Michigan have enjoyed a long
- 11 and mutually beneficial relationship. Michigan has a vibrant
- 12 Taiwanese American community that has enriched the state's culture,
- 13 cuisine, and commerce for decades. Taiwan was Michigan's tenth-
- 14 largest export market in Asia in 2024, with over 257 million
- 15 dollars' worth of Michigan goods exported to Taiwan that year. In
- 16 early March 2024, the state of Michigan opened the Michigan Taiwan
- 17 Office to promote further investment by Taiwanese firms in our
- 18 state. There is great potential for future growth if we continue to
- 19 deepen our ties with Taiwan; and
- 20 Whereas, In conducting business with Taiwan, Michigan
- 21 businesses should refer to Taiwan as "Taiwan." In 1979, the United
- 22 States enacted the Taiwan Relations Act to provide for the
- 23 continuation of relations between the people of the United States
- 24 and the people on the island of Taiwan. Section 4(b)(1) of the act
- 25 provides: "Whenever the laws of the United States refer or relate
- 26 to foreign countries, nations, states, governments, or similar
- 27 entities, such terms shall include and such laws shall apply with
- 28 respect to Taiwan." Thus, it is legitimate for Michigan businesses
- 29 to refer to Taiwan as "Taiwan" when conducting business and

- 1 establishing ties with Taiwan; and
- Whereas, The United States is actively taking steps to
- 3 strengthen bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan. On
- 4 June 1, 2023, representatives of the American Institute in Taiwan
- 5 and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the
- 6 United States signed a bilateral trade agreement under the U.S.-
- 7 Taiwan Initiative on 21st Century Trade, and Congress enacted
- 8 legislation to approve and implement that agreement in August 2023.
- 9 The first agreement under the U.S.-Taiwan Initiative on 21st
- 10 Century Trade officially came into effect on December 10, 2024,
- 11 marking a significant milestone. Negotiations regarding a second
- 12 agreement are ongoing. While this progress is encouraging, an
- 13 avoidance of double taxation agreement for Taiwan has not yet been
- 14 enacted, though legislation on this subject has been approved in
- 15 the United States House of Representatives. Taiwan also remains
- 16 excluded from the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity;
- **17** and
- 18 Whereas, Taiwan has undertaken a policy of "integrated
- 19 diplomacy, "highlighting values-based diplomacy, alliance
- 20 diplomacy, and economic and trade diplomacy. This policy
- 21 prioritizes mutual assistance and robust relationships with
- 22 governments that share common values. Taiwan is capable of, and
- 23 willing to, fulfill its responsibilities and collaborate with the
- 24 world to deal with the challenges of humanitarian aid and disease
- 25 control; now, therefore, be it
- 26 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we express our
- 27 commitment to the strengthening and deepening of ties between the
- 28 state of Michigan and Taiwan; and be it further
- 29 Resolved, That we urge all enterprises in Michigan to refer to

- 1 Taiwan as "Taiwan," consistent with the Taiwan Relations Act; and
- 2 be it further
- Resolved, That we urge the United States and Taiwan to enter
- 4 into additional bilateral trade agreements and an avoidance of
- 5 double taxation agreement; and be it further
- 6 Resolved, That we support the inclusion of Taiwan in the Indo-
- 7 Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity; and be it further
- 8 Resolved, That we support Taiwan's meaningful participation in
- 9 international organizations, such as the United Nations, the World
- 10 Health Organization, the International Civil Aviation Organization,
- 11 the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, and the
- 12 International Criminal Police Organization, which impact the
- 13 health, safety, and well-being of not only the people of Taiwan,
- 14 but the rest of the world; and be it further
- 15 Resolved, That we support Taiwan's aspiration to make more
- 16 contributions in international societies; and be it further
- 17 Resolved, That we support Taiwan in its efforts to increase
- 18 its international profile.
