SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 10

Senator Santana offered the following resolution: A resolution to recognize February 2025 as Black History 1 Month. 3 Whereas, The origins of Black History Month began as a concept in 1915, and in earnest in 1924 when Dr. Carter G. Woodson, through 4 his beloved Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., created Negro History 5 and Literature Week in the United States. Since 1976, every United 6 7 States President has adopted the month of February as Black History Month, an annual celebration of African-American achievements and 8 9 roles in our history; and 10 Whereas, As a result of growing awareness of Black identity and the contributions of the Civil Rights Movement, Black History 11 12 Month is a time to reflect on the burdens of racial prejudice and 13 to explore, understand, and appreciate the identities and cultures 14 across and within the African diaspora; and

Whereas, We pay tribute to, not only the many African-American 1 historical figures in our nation's history, but also the hidden 2 figures that have contributed to American ingenuity and innovation 3 throughout the existence of this great nation, the celebration of 4 5 which has evolved into a month-long celebration of Black progress and power; and 6 7 Whereas, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black 8 History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to "seize the opportunity to honor the too often neglected accomplishments of 9 10 Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history"; 11 and 12 Whereas, Michigan recognizes the injustices that African-Americans have endured and commends the African-American community 13 14 for the continuous pursuit of overcoming those injustices, while 15 changing the course and nature of history. We honor the prominent 16 leaders and activists who have paved the way for equality and justice; now, therefore, be it 17 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative 18 19 body recognize February 2025 as Black History Month; and be it 20 further Resolved, That we honor the contributions and sacrifices made 21 22 toward building pride in Black history and educating all Americans; 23 and be it further 24 Resolved, That we join other organizations throughout the 25 state of Michigan and this country to raise awareness about the hardships African-Americans have endured, celebrate the milestones 26

achieved, and continue the unrelenting pursuit of equality and
