## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 88

Senators Albert, Bellino, Daley, Johnson, Huizenga, Lauwers and Lindsey offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution calling on Governor Whitmer to opt-in to the new 2 Federal Tax Credit Scholarship Program for K-12 education.
- 3 Whereas, The fiscal year 2025 reconciliation act, commonly
- 4 referred to as the One Big Beautiful Bill Act, created a federally
- 5 funded tax credit scholarship program for students in elementary
- 6 and secondary public and private schools. This program will take
- 7 effect in 2027; and
- 8 Whereas, Under the program, taxpayers making donations to
- 9 qualified scholarship granting organizations will receive a
- 10 nonrefundable federal tax credit of up to \$1,700. The scholarship
- 11 granting organizations are then required to use these contributions
- 12 to give scholarships to public and private elementary and secondary
- 13 students located in their state. Under federal law, these

- 1 scholarships will constitute tax-free income for the recipients and
- 2 their families; and
- 3 Whereas, Each state has the option of participating in this
- 4 program. Authority to opt-in to the Federal Tax Credit Scholarship
- 5 Program rests with the governor of each state or such other
- 6 individual, agency, or entity designated by state law to make such
- 7 elections on behalf of the state with respect to federal tax
- 8 benefits. Governor Whitmer has not yet elected to participate in
- 9 the Federal Tax Credit Scholarship Program; now, therefore, be it
- 10 Resolved by the Senate, That we call on Governor Whitmer to
- 11 opt-in to the new Federal Tax Credit Scholarship Program for K-12
- 12 education; and be it further
- Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 14 Governor Gretchen Whitmer.
